Subject: 120-Day Delay of Miami-Dade Ordinance - Special Taxing District

This is an update to our two prior Bulletins, FL2018-03 and FL2018-06, regarding the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners' amendment to Ordinance 18-20.2.

On February 6, 2018, the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners passed Ordinance 18-12, which amended Ordinance 18-20.2 to require all sellers of real property located within a Special Taxing District to disclose on their deed that the property is located in a Special Taxing District, and to require the Buyer to acknowledge that disclosure of record. Enforcement of that Ordinance was scheduled to start on May 17, 2018. However, on May 15, 2018, the Board of County Commissioners for Miami-Dade County passed a 90-day delay in implementing Ordinance 18-12.

On July 25, 2018, the FLTA issued an Advocacy Update advising that the Board of County Commissioners for Miami-Dade County passed a 120-day delay in implementing Ordinance 18-12. That 120-day period commences on August 4, 2018 and runs through Dec. 2, 2018.
