

Real Property Liens for the State of **Missouri**

The following is a list of the most common types of liens affecting real estate in Missouri. It is not comprehensive, but should cover the majority of the liens that are found in a title search. The information below is effective as of **2019**. All *in personam* liens in Missouri attach to after-acquired property. Tenancy by the Entirety protection does not extend to *in rem* liens or federal liens. Please contact WFG's underwriting counsel for Missouri if you have any questions.

Civil Money	Circuit Court	Act as general in personam liens on real estate for ten

Financing Statements	Recorder of Deeds	Act as an in rem lien for five (5) years and may be

		assessments are collected by filing a regular lawsuit to

Estate Tax Liens	Circuit Court	Act as a general <i>in personam</i> lien on real estate owned	
		by the decedent's estate and do not expire. If reduced	
		to judgment against the beneficiaries of the estate,	
		they act the same as Civil Money Judgments. (see above)	
Inheritance Tax Liens	N/A.	Missouri does not have an inheritance tax.	
States Tax Liens	Circuit Court	Act as a general in personam lien on real estate for ten	
		(10) years and may be renewed one time prior to	
		expiring for an additional period of ten (10) years.	

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
