Subject: EMAIL WIRE SCAM INVOLVING IMPERSONATION OF MORTGAGE LENDER

You are advised that WFG National Title Insurance Company has learned of a recent email scam involving the impersonation of mortgage lenders, such as Genisys Credit Union and Gold Star Financial, by sending email messages from spoof domains, such as "geniyscu.org" and "goldstafinancial.net", respectively, to commit wire fraud. Additionally, WFG National Title Insurance Company has learned about the recent occurrences where facsimiles purporting to be from a party mortgage lender contained false mortgage loan payoffs.

The email wire fraud scheme that recently came to the attention of WFG National Title Insurance Company concerns an apparent attempt at committing wire fraud by means of impersonating <u>Genisys Credit Union</u> and <u>Gold Star Mortgage Financial Group</u> by sending emails coming from the spoof domains <u>"@geniyscu.org"</u> rather than <u>"@genisycu.org"</u>, and <u>"@goldstafinancial.net"</u> rather than <u>"@goldstarfinancial.com"</u>, respectively. In this scheme, the Title Underwriter's agents received emails from addresses using spoof domains and containing false payoffs with wiring instructions and contact information not belonging to the subject lender. The email and its domain were created and used to trick the agent into believing that the email came from a trusted source. Relying upon the false wiring instructions would have made the agent a victim of wire fraud. In addition, we have received recent reports of the transmission of false mortgage loan payoffs via facsimiles purporting to come from a party mortgage lender.
