Subject: South Carolina Data Security Act

I encourage you review either or both of these as soon as you can. There are several deadlines, but the most important one is July 1, 2019 when you must have a completed "Information Security Program" that meets all the details spelled out in the statute. That may seem like a long way off, but if you take the time to understand what is required, you will realize it will take some time and effort to achieve compliance with this requirement.

In summary, South Carolina became the first state to adopt the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) Model Act on Data Protection. This new statute imposes substantive obligations on both underwriters and their agents. Some of these obligations were part of ALTA's Best Practices as well as part of the Federal Graham Leach Bliley Act.

While §38-99-70 does contain an exemption for "licensees with fewer than ten employees, including any independent contractors" (think abstractors, IT personnel, or any outsiders your firm employs who would have access to the data), the exemption is not going to apply to most of our agents.
